Senator Jeff Stone Presents 2019 Vietnam Veterans Service Award to Bob Davies

The Veteran Service Awards are based on military service and contributions in their communities following their time in uniform. Bob was drafted in 1966 out of high school and joined the Air Force. He was assigned to 463d Military Airlift Support Group and 772d Tactical Airlift Squadron in Clark AFB Philippines. He served at Tan Son Nhut AFB in Saigon and Cam Ranh AFB in South Vietnam. His crew transported men and equipment to the forward areas in Vietnam in C-130's. Bob was at Tan Sun Nhut when the TET offensive (North Vietnamese attack) occurred. Bob's served 15 months+ in 1968-1969 with Recommendation for Presidential Unit Citation.

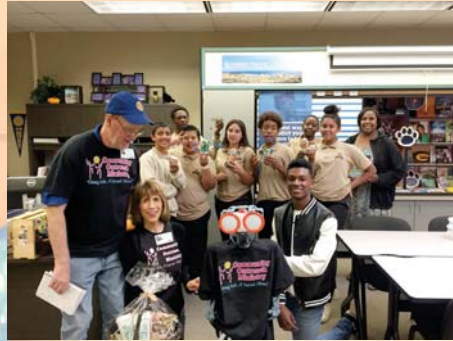

Summer Technology Camp

Community Outreach Ministry (COM) is excited to be partnering with Give Something Back Scholar Summer on Tuesday, July 9, 2019, from 1:00 pm 5:00 pm at the California State University San Bernardino campus. COM is hosting "Gearing Up For STEM" Mentor Protégé Workshops in two sessions. The workshops will start with Jacori Neal an 11th grade student at Temescal Canyon High School in Lake Elsinore presenting demonstrations of his Meccano Robots that he has personally built. Jacori is a COM mentor and a Give Something Back Scholar. Instructor Bob Davies and mentors will provide thirty (30) students between the ages of 14-17 with a STEM Robot Kit. The kit is A TECHNO LABS ROBO BLOX saltwater powered QUADBOT a DIY SPACE VEHICLE CLEAN ENERGY NO BATTERIES REQUIRED Robot. Another Instructor Edward Aguirre of Production Video of Temecula will teach a workshop on sixteen (16) Career Pathways with an emphasis on video technology.
