For 14 years, I have been able to share the love of Jesus Christ by helping incarcerated parents become more involved with their families through the Angel Tree Christmas program. Having been a Caregiver and recipient of Angel Tree services, I know firsthand the blessings that are derived from this ministry and it excites me to be an Angel Tree specialist for COM.



In any given year, I contact 40 or more families by phone, text or email explaining the program to the Caregiver and letting them know we will be getting a clothing and fun gift for each child. I share the suggestions made by the incarcerated parent, but ask the Caregiver if the gift reflects the child's current needs or desires, if not, I ask for the Caregivers gift ideas or child's wish list. The Caregivers are so thankful to know we care about them and their children. I invite them to the Angel Tree Christmas party and follow up by sending a text or email with their family number and the save the date flyer for the Angel Tree Christmas party. Every year, I look forward to this time of blessing others, but without fail I am the one who is always blessed.




